Summary of the Lake Shawnee Club Board Meetings

July 12, 2019

Former residents Alyson Music and April Lange Leaver from CAPP Beach addressed the Board regarding the current situation on Lake Hopatcong. Due to the advisory for HAB, their beach has been closed to swimming until further notice. They asked if Lake Shawnee would allow their members use of 1st Beach. The Board voted to allow CAPP Beach members to use 1st Beach on a trial basis beginning on Monday, July 22nd with future dates TBD if successful.

The Board discussed the Lake Hopatcong HAB advisory and the impact on local residents and businesses.

It was reported that there were extra security patrols on July 4^{th} and an email blast and a reminder on the Message Board to advise all members that fireworks are prohibited on Club properties.

The Social Committee held Yoga on 1st Beach, and the Ice Cream Social was very well attended on Tuesday night. Karaoke Night will be held on Saturday, July 20th along with the Swim Team.

It was noted that Solitude, our Lake Weed Management company, inspected the lake for HAB, and Agra will test all the intake areas.

Community Day was well attended although it rained a bit, and Scoot on Down was great. They were able to offset some of the costs by selling 50/50 and raffle tickets for 2 lottery ticket gift baskets. There was a brief discussion by the Board on the event.

New buoys for 1st and 3rd Beach were installed, parts for the lifeguard Walkie Talkies were ordered, the top sign light and flagpole light were replaced.


The Swim Team has three meets so far with 1 win and 2 losses. The meet on Community Day was the Tribe's first win and they celebrated with honking around the lake. All three meets were held at Lake Shawnee, including Shongum Lake. Lake Forest continues to utilize our docks, alternating practice times with our team. A ribbon meet was held here on Monday; our lifeguards stayed late for the event and there were a lot of swimmers in attendance. The Annual Golf Outing went very well, and they are selling First Aid kits for \$10 each.

It was reported that there are currently 6 boats with no stickers at White's Cove, one of them is in a handicap spot. The Board will try to resolve the issue. The several boards off the end of the dock at North End were removed due to rotten I-beam; 2 x 8s were installed to prevent injuries.

There was an update on the Clubhouse renovation project. Design drawings from the architect were sent out to contractors. Estimates have only been received by one contractor. The Board voted and approved funding of the construction drawings as needed to proceed with the project.

The Snack Shack is open and running and in need of volunteers.

There was a discussion regarding the recent COLA meeting with a presentation by Ms. Eileen Born on the new State law regarding homeowner associations and mandatory membership. It was noted that we will need to wait until PREDFDA (Planned Real Estate Development Full Disclosure Act) passes through the government before we update our bylaws.

Summary of the Lake Shawnee Club Board Meetings

August 2, 2019

The Swim Team made a proposal to the Board for a new fundraising idea. They no longer want to do the annual Golf Outing; sponsorship of the Swim Team is now their main fundraiser. They would like to do the Community Day event along with the Board and the Social Committee; the Swim Team would cook and sell food and open the Tricky Tray normally held at the golf outing to the entire lake. The Board voted in favor of the proposal.

Mr. Wilsusen updated the Board on the HAB situation on Lake Hopatcong. CAPP Beach members have been using our beach for the past two Mondays with no issues. They have provided a list of members who will be attending and their own security. Their members have been very appreciative.

This Wednesday, Camp Six Lake Hopatcong Triathlon will be utilizing the lake for swimmers and kayakers. They will provide a certificate of insurance and pedal bikes for safety for a small group of participants. They will be setting up on Tuesday night and gave a donation to the Club for the use of our facilities.

Jefferson Township Teen Scene requested to use our beach for an event, the Board was not in favor of the proposal.

The Board also decided not to make any changes to the Standing Rules regarding banning remote control electric boats on the Lake as requested.

Board discussed issues that occurred recently regarding the Club's lightning policy and clearing the beaches including on Community Day, Karaoke Night and the next day. The current Lifeguard procedures and policies were adopted from Lake Mohawk and state that upon hearing thunder guards will clear the water for 30 minutes and upon seeing lighting they will clear the property and advise all to seek shelter. An email blast was sent and a Facebook post to all members to inform them of the policy to avoid any further problems.

The was a request to hold a fundraiser at the Surf and Turf event to benefit member Sammie Iversen for her medical bills and medicine costs for her upcoming transplant.

Summer Social Committee activities have all been a success. There is one more Movie Night, one more Ice Cream Social (maybe two), and one more Story Time to go. Upcoming events include Trivia Night on August 16th and Surf and Turf on August 31st.

Solitude was out on the lake last week. There was a lot of Filamentous, but by the time they came out heavy rain had washed it away. There are some issues with weeds at North End that they will take care of next week. There was also an issue at White's Cove. Mr. Keith will survey the lake on paddleboard and will look at the situation.

It was noted that the lifeguards had a drill last week.

It was reported that there is a fishing contest coming up on August 10th.

The Lake Shawnee Swim Team finished the season tied with Lake Forest as Champions of the Small Lakes League for the 2^{nd} year in a row. Upcoming events include Silvers, the end of the season banquet, Trials and Finals, and a Swim a Thon to benefit Sammie Iversen. They are looking for dates for the Swim a Thon and they are hoping to invite the entire league to the event.

Notices were put on all untagged boats at White's Cove and one already has a sticker on it. A big abandoned boat on the handicap rack is still there; it will be moved and chained to the fence. An email blasts will be sent out, any other untagged boats will be removed.

There was a brief discussion on the Clubhouse renovation project. The architect is working the construction drawings and should be completed by August 16th. They will be sent out to the contractors for a bid by the end of August. We will start the permit process immediately and construction once the permits are approved. Plans were made for moving things out the Clubhouse and relocating the Club Office and finding alternate meeting locations.

It was reported that sales at the Snack Shack have been up, but no specific numbers were provided. A new rug will be purchased for the patio area and the Swim Team door hinge will be repaired or replaced.


