President's Message

July 2017

Finally, our summer season is now upon us and is in full swing. Never thought we were going to get out of the 50's! As the season begins, there are a couple reminders on our Club rules. Please be sure your guests are aware; it is your responsibility to inform them. You must use a koozie or other foam insulator when using glass bottles on our properties. This rule is simply for the protection and safety of all with bare feet should the bottle fall and break on the ground. A reminder of our no smoking policy at the 1st Beach and playground area as well at the upper part of the 2nd Beach property, and the Club has a carry in-carry out policy for personal trash (including plastic bottles!!) on all Club properties. I find our kids are the biggest culprit when it comes to leaving items around the property, so parents if you give them a snack or drink please monitor. I usually find lots of juice boxes and wrappers by the playground. These simple rules are in place to keep our properties clean & safe so all can enjoy.

I counted some 25-30 geese currently on the lake, with 12 new goslings. I urge our residents to please do not feed the waterfowl including our swans. It is actually unhealthy to the animal to feed them. Please educate your children to do the same. Be sure to harass the geese when you see them on Club property otherwise it becomes a poop fest and by doing so they will eventually go elsewhere.

Our night security patrols will begin on July 1st and I ask that all our residents and members do their part in making LS a safe and secure place to live. If you see suspicious persons or activity, please report to our local police and every member has the right to question persons on Club property to inquire if they are members. A reminder to please adhere to our 10 pm curfew on our properties, this includes the Third Beach for our young adult crowd!

Enjoy the start of Summer.

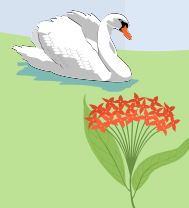
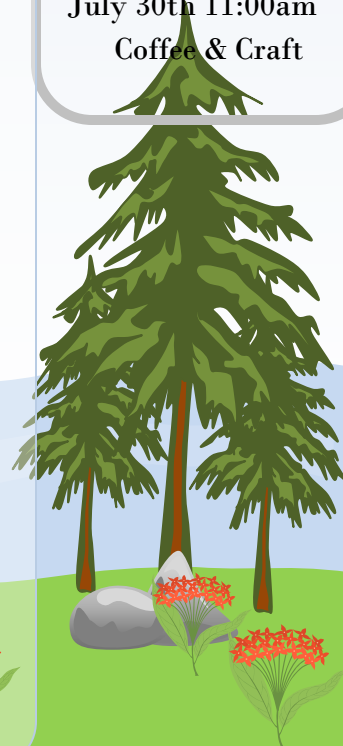

Summary of Lake Shawnee Club Board Meeting June 5, 2017

It was reported that a female swan in distress was captured and brought to an avian wildlife refuge. She unfortunately died as a result of her injuries. An autopsy was not performed due to the expense. The male swan is with nest and the signets.

Community Day is scheduled for June 24th including East vs. West Games, DJ and Photo Booth..

It was reported that it has been a tough spring for the lake with treatments due to all of the rain. Solitude has been out to treat the lake 7-8 times already this year and they didn't treat on several occasions due to the weather. There is a lot of mil-foil present at this time and the coves are especially in tough shape. Please contact the Board with any questions or issues with lake treatments rather than posting on social media.

Lifeguard certification/recertification class was held and 18 guards are on staff for the summer season.

Mr. Pete Lyden, the new Fishing Committee Chairperson, attended the meeting to introduce himself to the Board. Upcoming contest dates can be found on the newly revised Lake Shawnee website as well as the LSNews.

The Swim Team held their Swim Team kick off and introduced new head coach, Mr. Jamie Breiten. Assistant Coach is Ms. Samantha Gamble. The Annual Swim Team Golf outing will be held Friday, June 16th. Practices start the last week of school.

The Board discussed several upcoming and recently completed projects on Club properties including the following: new parking lot fence installed, reflectors to be purchased and installed, new anchor for First Beach raft to be purchased and installed, weeds at 2nd Beach, repairs completed on top stairs and landing at 2nd Beach, gate to be installed at 2nd Beach, basketball lines to be painted, repairs needed for stairs at 3rd Beach, ramp at 3rd repaired, and the North End light to be replaced,

The Property Improvement Committee met to discuss the proposed Clubhouse renovation project. Architect, Mr. Ken Fox, will make revisions to plans as suggested by the Committee.

The Snack Shack is currently looking for volunteers for the upcoming season.

The Board discussed and approved revisions to the Beach Party Policy that was instituted last year. The policy would only include weekends and holidays, since weekdays do not currently cause any problems.

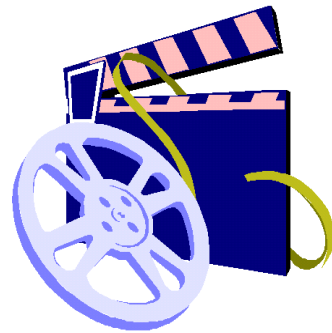

Boating Rules and Regulations

In addition to the Club's standing rules, boaters on Lake Shawnee must adhere and comply with all NJ State Boating regulations in order to operate on our lake. NJ Regulations can be found at http://www.njsp.org/maritime/pdf/title13ch82_042213.pdf.

Below are some of the most common questions and regulations:

BOAT REGISTRATION

All boats 12 foot or larger and all titled boats must be registered. In addition, any boat mechanically propelled, regardless of length, must be registered.

WEARING OF PERSONAL FLOATATION DEVICES BY CHILDREN 12 AND UNDER

Any child 12 years of age or younger must WEAR a properly fitted U.S. Coast Guard approved PFD whenever the vessel is underway.

RIDERS/PASSENGERS (Riding outside the vessel)

(a) The operator of a vessel shall not allow any person to ride in any position that would endanger life or limb nor allow passengers or cargo in excess of the maximum capacity stated on the manufacturer's or U.S. Coast Guard capacity label.

1. This prohibition includes, but is not limited to, any position where the person may be in danger of falling overboard.

2. This prohibition excludes all positions which may be necessary for the operation vessel.

For the safety of all our residents, we asked that all our boats comply with all NJ regulations and be courteous when operating on our lake.

Beach Rules

Current ID badges must be displayed while on all Club properties.

All Club properties must be vacated by 10:00 p.m.

Swim at your own risk when lifeguards are not on duty or not present.

Children under age 12 must be accompanied by a responsible person age 14 or older.

Unprotected glass containers are prohibited on beach properties. Glass containers when utilized must be in a protective or insulating container to prevent breakage

Bicycles or motorized vehicles are not permitted on the beaches.

Pets are prohibited on beach properties between Memorial Day and Labor Day.

All garbage and personal belongings must be removed each day.

Cigarette butts are not to be disposed of on Club property.

No sitting or hanging on the swim ropes or swim lanes.

When life guards are on duty, swimmers are not permitted to go outside the designated swim area. The swim area shall be determined by the lifeguards.

No rough play, pushing or shoving.

No swimming under rafts or docks.

One person at a time on any ladders.

Authority of the lifeguards and security persons must be respected. The lifeguards have the right to remove anyone from the property for not following the rules or acting in an unsafe or disrespectful manner.

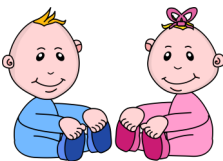
