

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT MARCH /APRIL, 2018

This month we begin publishing the LSC news every other month. Inside, you will see a letter from our editor explaining further the reason for this decision. I think you will be pleased going forward.

Mark your calendar!!!! If you have never attended one of our annual meetings before, PLEASE try and make an effort to attend this year's meeting scheduled for Saturday, March 10th at 11 am at the Clubhouse. Meetings the last few years have been around an hour. We need a quorum (10%) of the total membership in good standing, which is currently about 50 members, to conduct Club business. And just to be clear, if two members of the same household show up it only counts as one Club member for quorum purposes. The annual meeting is an opportunity for our Board of Governors and its' committees to report to the membership all the activities of the Club. We have our annual elections and a bylaw addition to vote on. We will be presenting updates on this year's planned dam improvements and the status of our possible clubhouse renovations. The annual meeting packet is posted on our webpage under the members only section. As always, we will have light refreshments after the meeting.

Unfortunately, we were not able to get our Winter Carnival in again this year. We had the ice, but the weather would just not cooperate. Our swim team committee begins its monthly meetings so if you have a potential swimmer please try and attend. Our social committee is finally seeing some new faces with some new ideas which is very encouraging, and we hope the enthusiasm continues.

Club dues invoices will be going out shortly. The Board works hard to control our costs and to be fiscally conservative. Please remember that it is important for ALL members, not just a few, to donate some of your time to the Club from time to time, especially at our work days and through our committees to help control those costs. Without volunteerism, our dues would be significantly higher, especially if we had to pay for all the labor to complete many of the projects and run events throughout the year. While paying your dues this year, we ask our members to please update their contact information with the Club. It would be helpful to include your current phone numbers and email addresses when returning your dues invoice even if you have done so in the past.

Our annual work day is scheduled for April 21st. As always, we need volunteers to help get the Club properties ready for the season. Please consider coming out for an hour or two to help out. We have a light breakfast at 8 am and head out to the properties thereafter. If you are not sure where to go or what you can do, just stop at the clubhouse first. We are generally done by 12 noon and have lunch available. There will be a Signup Genius put out at the beginning of April.



Summary of the Lake Shawnee Club Board Meeting February 2, 2018

The Social Committee reported that they had to reschedule the Winter Carnival from January 29th to February 11th due to lack of sufficient ice. February 17th is 80s Night thanks to member Anthony from "Hot Rods". February 19th is Kids Cooking Class with Mr. Matrisciano.

LS News committee decided to reduce the frequency of the paper to every other month and to move printing to Post Net in Lake Hopatcong. The committee wanted to improve the quality of the paper and felt by reducing the frequency, they could achieve that goal. The new format will begin with the March newsletter.

It was reported that during the recent hydro raking some debris was placed on the islands; milk weed will be planted in the spring to create habitats for monarch butterflies. In addition, grass seed needs to be spread in the spring on several properties used during the project.

The Board reviewed and voted to approve the annual budget as completed by the Budget Committee, which will be presented to the membership at the Annual Meeting in March.

The Annual Swim Team Golf Outing is scheduled for June 15th at Black Bear Golf Course.

The Property Improvement Committee met on January 25th. They discussed the loan amount available, how to phase in and prioritize the plans, and new cost saving ideas for handicap access. Mr. Wilsusen will meet with

architect, Mr. Ken Fox, to discuss suggestions made by the committee; construction plans can then be completed.

It was reported that since all current Board members wished to remain in their positions and no one wished to run against them, a nominating committee did not need to be formed this year. The slate of nominations will be included in the annual meeting notice.

A bylaw amendment regarding vacant lots will need to be voted on at the Annual Meeting and will be included in the Annual Meeting notice.





Fertilizers/Septics

To keep our lake healthy, a reminder as per Township Ordinance be sure to use non-phosphorus fertilizers on your lawn this season and this is a good time of year to get your septic pumped if you are due this year per the Township septic management ordinance. As per the ordinance, all septics have to be pumped every three years and all generally receive a notice when you permit expires. It is not only good for your septic it helps the water quality of our lake.








ST. PATRICK'S DAY CROSSWORD PUZZLE



NJ STATE BOATING REGULATIONS

We never had to really mention it before as most of the boats on the lake were sail or row boats. But now that we have more & more larger boats on the lake it is important to remind our members of a few of the NJ State regulations regarding boats. Even though we are a private lake, boaters must still comply with State Laws.

In addition children under 12 in kayaks, canoes are required to wear a USCG-approved PFD while on the lake.

Navigational Lights (while operating at night)

Power-driven vessels:

If vessel construction began after December 24, 1981 and the boat is 12 meters (39 feet) *or more* in length, it must display:

- A green light on the starboard (right) side of the boat
- A red light on the port (left) side of the boat
- A masthead light (225 degrees) and a stern light (135 degrees).
- If vessel construction began after December 24, 1981 and the boat *is under* 12 meters (39 feet) in length, it may exhibit the same lights required for vessels under 20 meters when the construction was started before December 25, 1981.

Sailing Vessels and Vessels under Oars:

Sailing vessels under sail alone must display:

- Red and green sidelights visible from a distance of at least one mile on a dark clear night
- A stern light visible from a distance of at least two miles.
- Sailing vessels of less than 7 meters(22 feet) must display, and vessels under oars may display, if practicable, the lights prescribed above, but if not, it must have ready at hand an electric torch or lighted lantern showing a white light.

Vessel Registration

Boats that fit into the following categories do not have to be registered:

- A non-powered sailboat or vessel used only on small lakes, ponds or within private lands;
- Vessels 12 feet or less in length;
- A non-powered kayak or canoe.

Personal Floatation Device (PFD)

All vessels, except surfboards, racing shells, rowing sculls and racing kayaks, must be equipped with one PFD of the correct size for each person onboard.

All PFD's must be readily accessible and in serviceable condition.

Vessels more than 16 feet in length must carry one Type IV (throwable) USCG-approved flotation device in addition to the required number of wearable type PFD's.

Mandatory PFD Usage

All children 12 years old and under must wear a USCG-approved PFD while onboard <u>any vessel</u> including kayaks, canoes that is underway. The PFD may be removed if the child is inside a fully enclosed, permanent part of the vessel that is designed by the manufacturer to carry passengers.
