- **The first Thanksgiving was held in the autumn of 1621** and included 50 Pilgrims and 90 Wampanoag Indians and lasted three days. Many historians believe that only five women were present at that first Thanksgiving, as many women settlers didn't survive that difficult first year in the U.S.
- **Thanksgiving didn't become a national holiday until over 200 years later!** Sarah Josepha Hale, the woman who actually wrote the classic song "Mary Had a Little Lamb," convinced President Lincoln in 1863 to make Thanksgiving a national holiday, after writing letters for 17 years campaigning for this to happen.
- **No turkey on the menu at the first Thanksgiving:** Historians say that no turkey was served at the first Thanksgiving! What was on the menu? Deer or venison, ducks, geese, oysters, lobster, eel and fish. They probably ate pumpkins, but no pumpkin pies. They also didn't eat mashed potatoes or cranberry relish, but they probably ate cranberries. And no, Turduckens (a turkey stuffed with a duck stuffed with a chicken) were nowhere to be found during that first Thanksgiving.
- **Thanksgiving is the reason for TV dinners!** In 1953, Swanson had so much extra turkey (260 tons) that a salesman told them they should package it onto aluminum trays with other sides like sweet potatoes — and the first TV dinner was born!
- **Thanksgiving was almost a fast — not a feast!** The early settlers gave thanks by praying and abstaining from food, which is what they planned on doing to celebrate their first harvest, that is, until the Wampanoag Indians joined them and (lucky for us!) turned their fast into a three-day feast!
- **Why is Thanksgiving the fourth Thursday in November?** President Abe Lincoln said Thanksgiving would be the fourth Thursday in November, but in 1939 President Roosevelt moved it up a week hoping it would help the shopping season during the Depression era. It never caught on and it was changed back two years later.
- **The Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade began in 1924** with 400 employees marching from Convent Ave to 145th street in New York City. No large balloons were at this parade, as it featured only live animals from Central Park Zoo.
- **How did the tradition of watching football on Thanksgiving start?** The NFL started the Thanksgiving Classic games in 1920 and since then the Detroit Lions and the Dallas Cowboys have hosted games on Turkey Day. In 2006, a third game was added with different teams hosting.
- **Wild turkeys can run 20 miles per hour when they are scared,** but domesticated turkeys that are bred are heavier and can't run quite that fast.

Summary of the Lake Shawnee Club Board Meetings

September 7, 2018

The Social Committee reported on recent events including the Kids' Biathlon/Color War and the Surf n Turf with a rescheduled Movie Night following. Upcoming events include the Dog Walk on Sept. 22nd. The Social Committee is currently looking for a new chairperson.

It was noted that boats were having trouble with weeds at North End and other areas. Weather had been an issue and weeds that were normally on the bottom rose due to an increase in oxygen. Surveys of the lake were completed to examine the problem.

Summer Night Security is done, and it was an uneventful summer.

Lifeguards and Summer Security finished their season on Labor Day. It was noted that it was a very light summer, especially due to the weather.

It was reported that the Swim Team finished the season as Champions of the Small Lakes Division and as the winner of the league's Sportsmanship Award. Coach Jamie Brieten and Coach Jodi Bunda did a fantastic job leading the "Tribe" in a successful season.

It was determined that the bushes at White's Cove were cut down by the beavers. It was reported that the new Al's Landing sign was installed at White's Cove.

The Board continues to move forward with the proposed Clubhouse renovation project.

The Snack Shack closed for the season with a final profit of \$503.

October 12, 2018

There was a report of tree damage at First Beach. A tree company cleaned up the mess and will come back to trim some other dead branches. An arborist will be contacted to survey the tree and any others on Club properties to determine if they need to be trimmed or removed.

The Club's email account had an issue in mid-September, which has been resolved.

It was noted that although she sold her primary residence in Lake Shawnee, Ms. Lisa Peter will remain Office Manager. She and husband Glen plan to travel through the winter and Ms. Carolyn Sior will continue to serve in the interim.

The Social Committee noted upcoming events including Beer Tasting, Trunk or Treat and the Social Committee planning meeting on Nov 6th

It was reported that the lake was in great shape this year thanks to our contractor from Solitude. July was our biggest hit; milfoil continued to be a problem, especially where water sits. Although there was a treatment at the end of August, by Labor Day there were areas with heavy weeds. It was noted that the filamentous algae must be treated when it happens; it was our biggest issue because it gets hung up on still spots. We ended the season with no further treatments. They did remove some lilies, which are easy to treat but conditions need to be right.

Bids have been obtained for the upcoming Clubhouse renovation, as well as for tree removal needed in preparation for the project. The Board discussed the delay in the start time for the project, the time line for construction and the impact on rentals. There was also a discussion on repairs needed on the Clubhouse due to the delay in the project including window and roof repairs.

Ice Safety Outdoor ice sports and activities can be safe and enjoyable, but there is no such thing as 100 percent safe ice. Anyone who spends time near the ice should first determine the ice conditions, and then take precautions to stay safe.

Preventing Ice Accidents

Follow these guidelines to avoid accidents when on or near ice:

Check the ice thickness before going out. To be safe, ice should be solid and at least 4 inches thick.

Remember, the ice may not be the same thickness over the entire area of a lake or pond.

Test ice thickness by using a chisel, cordless drill or ice auger.

Be safe—the more people on the ice, the thicker it should be. Use ice on smaller, shallower and slower-moving bodies of water for ice activities, it is usually more solid.

Look for objects sticking up through the ice and mark them as hazards.

Do not go out on ice that has recently frozen, thawed and then frozen again. This happens in the spring and early winter as temperatures change often. Wait until the outside temperature has been below freezing long enough that at least 4 inches of solid ice forms over the entire area. Always stay with at least one other person.

Oil Tank Protection:

As a suggestion, check with your local heating oil or furnace service provider as to protective oil tank containers. These are rigid plastic container tubs that protect the metal oil tank from the elements. They help protect against "oil gel" causes by cold temperatures, and keep the rain and snow off the tank. Also; in the event of tank failure, the protective container will hold the oil, preventing an environmental issue. I had one installed a few years ago, if you would like to see. 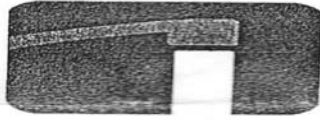
