MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

JULY/AUGUST, 2018

Looks like our summer season is finally now upon us and is in full swing. The lake and properties are looking awesome and our social and event calendar is packed for the summer.

Our first home swim meet is on Monday, July 2nd at 6 pm. Please come out and support the team and enjoy the Snack Shack. Our swim team numbers have been dwindling over the years and the swim team could always use some new members, so, if you have a child that has any interest please stop down to any practice to see if it is something they may want to participate in. Great job by Chris Iversen and all our swim team parents in getting the facilities in tip-top shape.

Great job, as always, by Bob Denbleyker and committee once again on a very successful 30th annual Lake Shawnee Swim Team golf outing. I would like to thank the Denbleyker's who have been running the outing for many years and this will be their last. Thank you!

Guarding started full time at 1st beach and Tuesday, Thursday and weekends at 3rd beach. Please make sure you are in possession of your badges, or wristband when on Club property. Boat and car stickers should be displayed, as well. Doing so will help to avoid any confusion and make it easier for Kristen to do her job.

As our summer season begins, a couple of reminders on our Club rules and please be sure your guests are aware; it is your responsibility to inform them. You must use a koozie or other foam insulator when using glass bottles on our properties. This rule is simply for the protection and safety of all with bare feet running around should the bottle fall and break on the ground. A reminder of our no smoking policy at the 1st Beach grounds and playground area as well at the upper part of the 2nd Beach property and the Club has a carry in-carry out policy for personal trash (including plastic bottles) on all Club properties. I find our kids are the biggest culprit when it comes to leaving items around the property, so parents if you give them a snack or drink please monitor; I usually find lots of juice boxes and wrappers by the playground.

Last, as a reminder, we require a party permit for parties of 7 or more non-member guests, max. of 20(not including members). This is so we can ensure we have enough guards on duty and to avoid conflicts with multiple parties, clubhouse rentals and/or club events on the same day so we don't overburden the facilities. Please call the office at least a week (7 days) prior, first come first serve. If you fail to obtain a permit prior, you may jeopardize having your party on that day so please call to avoid any issues.

These simple rules are in place the keep our properties clean & safe and so that all can enjoy.

Our night security patrols will begin on June 30th and I ask that all our residents and members do their part in making LS a safe and secure place to live. If you see suspicious persons or activity, please report to our local police. Every member has the right and obligation to question persons on Club property to inquire if they are members.

Update on our dam improvement project. We met with DEP a few months ago and are making some final touches on the plans. Not sure if we will have the final approvals back in time to get bids for fall construction. We are also in the process of obtaining quotes for our Clubhouse expansion and renovations. Once we have a better idea of the cost, I will be putting out more information to our members.

As many of our members know, we changed and updated out boat policy and in particular our boat storage policy on Club properties. We have been issuing permits only for the number of racks available as to keep the properties looking good and not have boats laying all over the place. A number of members took out storage permits have not yet placed a boat on property. If you do not intend to store a boat on Club property, please return the permit and we will issue a general boat permit. We have a number of members that would like to store their boat so we would appreciate your cooperation.

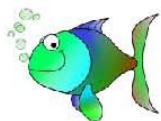

Summary of the Lake Shawnee Club Board Meetings

May 4, 2018

The Board held their annual New Member Mixer to welcome new members to the Lake Shawnee community.

All work was completed early on Work Day thanks to the good turnout of volunteers. The fence at White's Cove was completed along with other minor projects on all properties.

There was a brief discussion on the informational meeting on NJ Natural Gas.

The Social Committee reported on upcoming events including Community Kick Ball on June 10th at Stanlick School for ages 14 & up, Movie Night/Campout on June 15th. Community Day on June 23rd with a new game format, and Pajama Story Time on June 28th at 7pm at 3rd Beach.

It was reported that Solitude treated Beaver Cove and the 2 islands for variable leaf milfoil; more will be treated in two weeks. Since there was not a lot of ice this year there will be a lot more weeds, but so far, we are in good shape.

The Swim Team started registration for the upcoming season. They began a project to replace the fascia for the turn boards and hope to have this completed by their Work Days in June. Mr. Jamie Brieten will be Head Coach and Ms. Jodi Bundha will be Assistant Coach this year. The Swim Team will hold their Kick Off on May 20th and want to emphasize the "Tribe" feeling of the team this season; they had decided last year to change their name to the Lake Shawnee Tribe to represent the "family" attitude of the team.

The Board discussed upcoming projects and recent repairs on Club properties including repairing steps at Second Beach, spraying weeds on lower beach area, installing Port A Johns on all properties, mulching swings and playground at 2nd Beach, repairing steps at Third Beach, repairing anchor on raft at Third Beach, and installing new picnic table at White's Cove.

Mr. Wilsusen reported that he and Mr. Gerri Remsen recently had a meeting with the NJDEP head engineer on our project to discuss numerous changes that were requested by the new engineer to our submitted plans.

The Snack Shack is currently seeking volunteers for the upcoming season.

The Board continued the discussion regarding the new boat policy, specifically the number of racks available for members on the properties.

June 8, 2018

Several members attended the meeting to address the Board regarding issues with the new Boat Permit Policy. There was a discussion regarding the lack of available spots for member and several suggestions were offered including building more racks. The Board will work with the community to get all members spots for their boats and they will address the issues that have arisen. It was decided that the Board will reconvene at a later date to discuss the issue in more depth.

The Social Committee reported on upcoming events including the 1st Community Kick Ball game on Saturday, June 9th (date change).

It was noted that the lake was treated twice at the end of April for Milfoil and Variable Leaf Milfoil. All milkweed was planted on the islands in Beaver Cove and North End. Thank you to member Debbie Zweig for the seeds.

Summer Night Security will begin on June 30th. Volunteer packets will be sent out shortly.

The lifeguards are up and running beginning on Memorial Day started and lifeguard training has been completed.

It was reported that the Swim Team will hold the 30th Annual Swim Team Golf Outing on June 15th.

Recent work on Club properties include installing all ropes and floats at 1st Beach, turning the raft, removing the tree growth in the sand, and removing brush and trees at the Clubhouse. In addition, a plaque in honor of Mike Adams was installed at the flagpole at 1st Beach.

The Property Improvement Committee reconvened to review two version of plans provided by architect, Mr. Ken Fox.

It was reported that work continues with plans that need to be resubmitted to the NJDEP.

The Board voted to approve a rental defibrillator as required by new regulations.

Lake Shawnee Club Policy

Policy for use of Club Properties for Parties/Events

- 1) Beginning the first Friday of Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day, any member utilizing Club properties for any private party/event on weekends or holidays where non-member guests will exceed 7 or more guests, the hosting member is required to notify the Club office at least one week prior to the party/event to detail the type of party/event to be held which can be subject to Club approval.
 - a. All approved private parties/events will be issued a permit for the day. Failure to obtain a permit in a timely manner will result in denial and/or cancellation of the party.
 - b. This section does not apply to any clubhouse rentals and or member only parties/events.
- 2) Picnic tables are limited to one per member family, this applies at all times.
- 3) Any private parties/events, non-member guests cannot exceed 20 guests.
- 4) The Club reserves the right to deny any private parties/events based on scheduled Club events, clubhouse rentals and other reserved parties the same day. Private party/event permits will be issued on first come first serve basis and at no time will exceed three private parties per day per property.
- 5) Members are responsible for all their non-member guests and their adherence to Club rules at any private party/event.
- 6) Pop up(EZ up) tents are limited to one per party not to exceed 10x10 within the beach/picnic areas and 20x20 within the dock/grass area at first beach. This applies to member only, club events and private parties.
- 7) Set up of private and/or member only parties/events should not occur before 6am the day of the party/event. This includes the reserving of picnic tables for any purpose.
- 8) The Club requires wrist bands be worn by all non-member guests at any private parties/events which will be provided by the Club.
- 9) Any member who wishes to enter into any rental agreement for party rental equipment, inflatable's or any other equipment to be used on Club property that may require an insurance liability waiver must contact the Club for approval prior to signing of any contracts.
- 10) The rights of Club members and common courtesy, including but not limited to the use of any music, should be paramount when hosting private parties and events on Club property.

Beach Rules

Current ID badges must be displayed while on all Club properties

All Club properties must be vacated by 10 pm

Swim at your own risk when lifeguards are not on duty or not present

Children under 12 must be accompanied by a responsible person 14 or older

Unprotected glass containers are prohibited on beach properties. Glass containers when utilized must be in a protective or insulating container to prevent breakage

Bicycles or motorized vehicles are not permitted on the beaches

Pets are prohibited on beach properties between Memorial Day and Labor Day

All garbage & personal belongings must be removed each day. Cigarette butts are not to be disposed of on club property

No sitting or hanging on the swim ropes or swim lanes

When guards are on duty, swimmers are not permitted to go outside the designated swim area. The swim area shall be determined by the lifeguards

No rough play, pushing or shoving

No swimming under rafts or docks

One person at a time on any ladders

Authority of the lifeguards and security persons must be respected.

The lifeguards have the right to remove anyone from the property for not following the rules or acting in an unsafe or disrespectful manner.

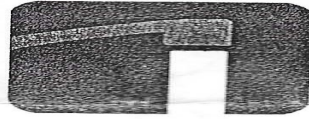

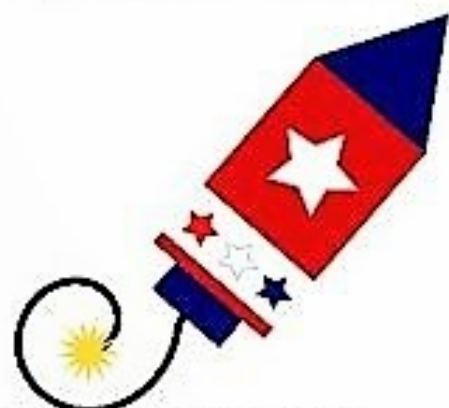

The Work Curse

Big deal! I promised my friend that I would listen to his Amway “motivational tapes.” I could handle it. The speaker talked very little, if at all, about network distribution marketing and mostly about how unhappy I really was for working hard and going nowhere. He told me how manipulated I was by the work system, all stressed out by the rat race, and for regretting all the things that I didn’t have – including time with my family. I felt like a victim... I was depressed for days. Was I the fool for believing the lie of the American Dream? Where did the old-fashioned work ethic go that once promised fair pay for hard work.

I searched for answers starting with the Work curse of mankind found in the 3rd chapter of the Bible: “By the sweat of your brow you will eat your food until you return to the ground, since from it you were taken; for dust you are and to dust you will return.” It was hard to see any blessing in this arrangement -. especially if I choose to ignore the arrangement before the curse. The paycheck is the validation for the sweat of hard work because the road of the breadwinner’s job has always been full of thorns and thistles to be conquered. The “right” to a gilded life and easy money is the subtle lie that has crept into my thinking!

Whether you are a roofer on a hot day or a Wall-Streeter on a sticky commute – the sweat is inevitable. An underpaid single mom and an over-mortgaged couple share a common stress with most American workers – they sweat the bills. The longshoremen on a wildcat strike and the advertising executive who is late on a deadline share something in common – they sweat their jobs. Perhaps the workplace has depleted your energy with the repetitive task or the overbearing boss. Now your satisfaction of a stable fair wage, purpose driven contribution and relationship with peers is undercut by technology and progress. So what if the world gets more connected as the worker becomes more isolated and susceptible to the seeds of discontent!

A perfect example of “returning to dust” occurred during the industrial revolution of the 1840’s. A valuable source of nitrates for fertilizers and explosives were discovered in two-hundred-foot-thick deposits of sun baked bird manure on the remote Guano Islands off the coast of Peru. The mining conditions were unbearable and deadly. Acrid clouds of poisonous dust covered the naked bodies of the Chinese coolies during the few short months while they worked and then covered what was left of them after the dogs and vultures were through. Their work and their lives literally returned to the dust. Is that how you feel sometimes? – So unfair – but there is hope!

God built a secret into work, but the worker has a look for it. The wise king Solomon declared life meaningless if this secret is left undiscovered. He said, “Whatever your hand finds to do, do it with all your might... for the dust returns to the ground where it came from and the spirit returns to God who gave it.” (Eccl. 7-10 & 12-7). He wants us to look up and learn the secret of being content in any and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether living in plenty or want. The secret of living in His spirit is gratitude and thankfulness during our daily walk in His eternal provision – even in our temporal work. Work is a form of grace to keep us from becoming conceited. He wants the worker to see work as an acceptable sacrifice, like a gift in the curse. Work is our fair wage to the Creator and unlike your production minded earthly boss, He is looking to give you more than you deserve. The bonus plan is awesome!

NJ STATE BOATING REGULATIONS

We never had to really mention it before as most of the boats on the lake were sail or row boats. But now that we have more & more larger boats on the lake it is important to remind our members of a few of the NJ State regulations regarding boats. Even though we are a private lake, boaters must still comply with State Laws.

In addition children under 12 in kayaks, canoes are required to wear a USCG-approved PFD while on the lake.

Navigational Lights (while operating at night)

Power-driven vessels:

If vessel construction began after December 24, 1981 and the boat is 12 meters (39 feet) **or more** in length, it must display:

- A green light on the starboard (right) side of the boat
- A red light on the port (left) side of the boat
- A masthead light (225 degrees) and a stern light (135 degrees).
- If vessel construction began after December 24, 1981 and the boat **is under** 12 meters (39 feet) in length, it may exhibit the same lights required for vessels under 20 meters when the construction was started before December 25, 1981.

Sailing Vessels and Vessels under Oars:

Sailing vessels under sail alone must display:

- Red and green sidelights visible from a distance of at least one mile on a dark clear night
- A stern light visible from a distance of at least two miles.
- Sailing vessels of less than 7 meters(22 feet) must display, and vessels under oars may display, if practicable, the lights prescribed above, but if not, it must have ready at hand an electric torch or lighted lantern showing a white light.

Vessel Registration

Boats that fit into the following categories do not have to be registered:

- A non-powered sailboat or vessel used only on small lakes, ponds or within private lands;
- Vessels 12 feet or less in length;
- A non-powered kayak or canoe.

Personal Floatation Device (PFD)

All vessels, except surfboards, racing shells, rowing sculls and racing kayaks, must be equipped with one PFD of the correct size for each person onboard.

All PFD's must be readily accessible and in serviceable condition.

Vessels more than 16 feet in length must carry one Type IV (throwable) USCG-approved flotation device in addition to the required number of wearable type PFD's.

Mandatory PFD Usage

All children 12 years old and under must wear a USCG-approved PFD while onboard any vessel including
